www.photos4artists.co.uk

This website offers free pictures that you can use to help you out in these situations. The photos range from simple reference pictures such as a piece of fruit to landscapes, scenes with buildings, boats etc. Some of these images are good enough to make great paintings as they are.

You can search the site for items of interest which is quicker than leafing through books hoping to find something that would do. The pictures are of high quality and do not lose any resolution when you zoom in on particular areas. Compositionally they are good but don't forget you can also crop the images to suit your needs. If you don't have a computer you can try the ones in the library.

According to the site:

"You may publish, sell or otherwise display any painting, drawing or other work of art that

is a representation of a photo published on this site so long as it is completely original and is in no way a digitally or electronically formed or altered copy of a photo published on this site."

So no copyright worries either!

Put your painting on the website

Don't forget you can put your work on the group's website. Electronic photos are needed for this. If you don't have a digital camera, bring your paintings in and Jo can photograph them for you.
